Objectives:

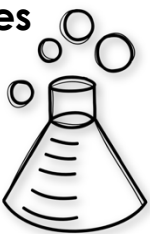
- Obtain a general knowledge of the basic principles of biological systems (i.e.: genetics, cell biology, biochemistry, and evolution)

• Grades

Each assignment will be posted in PowerSchool.

A grade of "1" indicates a missing assignment that may be submitted for credit.

A grade of "0" indicates a final grade not eligible for make-up.

All other posted grades are final: annotations provided for low marks explain points lost.

• Academic Integrity

Students are expected to adhere to the strictest standards of academic honesty. Cheating or plagiarism of any kind will result in an automatic grade of zero for that assignment. Repeated issues will be referred to administration in accordance with school policy.

HERE ARE A FEW ADDITIONAL PIECES OF INFORMATION:

Classroom Rules:

1. *Maintain clear aisles* – store personal belongings and backpacks under assigned tables.

Cell Phone Class Policy

Attendance:

Students are responsible for checking assignments in Schoology when absent. Extended time for missed material may be granted for excused absences but must be confirmed with the teacher. Assignments receive no credit during unexcused absences.

CELL PHONE/ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

Saraland High School has adopted a 1:1 device program. Digital citizenship and competency will be emphasized in all classes. Students will be assigned a Chromebook for use during class.

The SHS cell phone policy will be enforced as written in the Student Handbook. This means cell phones will **NOT** be allowed out during class time for any reason.

Students will turn in phones at the beginning of each class period to the designated pockets when entering class. Phones must be on silent mode. If there is a family emergency or you need to contact your student during instructional time, please call the front office at 251-602-8970. Our office staff will locate the student immediately for emergencies or deliver messages as needed.

If a student refuses to turn in their phone to the proper location and is caught having their phone out during class time, for any reason without permission, they will be asked to turn in their phone at that time. It will be delivered to an administrator, and the student will be permitted to pick it up after school. Subsequent offences are handled according to the guidelines in the Handbook.

When Chromebooks or other devices are being used as instructional tools, the following rules must always be followed:

- Students will use and maintain individually assigned device.
- Students will complete assignments related only to the instructional lesson.
- Students will not send text messages or make calls to others inside or outside of class.
- Students will not record any image, video, or audio of other students or the teacher without permission.
- Students will not post any recordings or images to online websites without permission.
- Students will practice internet safety with online resources.
- Students will only send and post appropriate and authorized text, audio, and visual media to websites approved by the teacher.
